PURPOSE

The client contracted Greenleaf to perform Hazardous Materials (Hazmat) collection, packaging and transportation services for materials encountered on vacant properties as part of a right of way clearance project for new power line installation.

PROJECT APPROACH

In preparation for installing new high voltage power lines, the client acquired property along the proposed right of way for the new lines, including several former residential and farm properties. Upon performing pre-demolition inspections of the properties, numerous Hazmat was encountered, requiring proper removal and packaging for transport prior to any demolition commencing. The scope of the work performed to date included:

- Removed and packaged numerous paints, herbicides, insecticides and cleaning fluids from seven properties.
- Collected and bulked over 500 cans of paint that had been discovered on one parcel where



they had been improperly dumped down a hillside.

- Coordinated the transportation of all packaged wastes to their respective disposal facilities.

RESULTS

All properties were cleared for demolition in advance of the schedule required for completion.

SITUATION

During site preparation activities for a new distribution center, the general contractor encountered soil with elevated levels of arsenic. The impacted soil required removal and replacement with suitable fill in order to complete site work activities and begin construction of the distribution center. Greenleaf Environmental was contract to provide transportation and disposal services to the engineering firm on the project.

PROJECT APPROACH

Due to the time critical nature of the removal, Greenleaf Environmental subcontracted with several haulers and coordinated with the landfill to provide extended hours to accept trucks from the project. Greenleaf provided a full time onsite transportation and disposal coordinator to work directly with the trucking companies and landfill on a daily basis, scheduling trucks and alerting



the landfill of daily volume expectations, including working on Saturdays to expedite the project.

RESULTS

Greenleaf was able to move almost 29,000 tons of soil in a five week period, including one week of downtime for analytical result turnaround and re-excavation.
